#### MISSIONS PHILOSOPHY

We started on deputation for Russia in 1999. In two decades of living in four countries, and traveling to more than forty, we have learned a lot about the world, and a lot about missions. For the first time in a long time, we have had space to pause and reflect on the past, and strategically think through the future. With the opportunity to lead a missions organization, I thought it would be a great time to give you our philosophy of missions. The first of three principles that I will share is that of "Effectiveness."

The picture above was taken at the Bibelseminar of Bonn, in Germany. Touring this campus with friends some years ago, we discovered a dynamic institution training leaders from the Russian-German community. In short, we found people who were effectively ministering to their context. Our first point of being successful in missions, is asking, "Do you know your context?" Do you know where you live, and do you understand the people who live around you?
