Since my last letter, I have traveled to speak in almost a dozen churches in three countries, on Zoom, and in person, from Washington State to Washington DC. On the trip to the DC area, I brought Jackson along and spent a couple of hours giving him a quick tour of the monuments and the capitol area in a state of lockdown.

Almost twenty years ago, Sarah and I were in this same area on September 13, and saw the damaged Pentagon after the hijackers had crashed a plane into it. It is surreal to come back to the same area so many years later with a child, and see the Capitol in a similar state of lockdown.

It seems that the last two decades of our lives, we have lived as the world around us lurched from crisis to crisis. Ministries have risen and fallen. Wars have broken out and stopped.
