In April, we were able to see two of our new believers get baptized. Our church doesn't have a baptistry, so this was a challenge. In the past, they've used a river or even driven an hour to use another church's baptistry. However, this time, we wanted to find a more permanent solution. After some research and aided by the idea of water basins that we used in Togo, we went down to a farm supply store and picked up a 350gallon cattle water trough! It was so exciting to see both Love and Emilie take this step of obedience in their lives. Please pray that other believers would take this important step as well.

Sadly, we have lost a few members lately as they've moved away. Several of these were still very new believers. Please pray that Ali, Daniel, and Emilie will all find good churches and continue to grow in their faith in their new locations.

Six weeks ago, a young Nigerian women named Eunice started attending our church with her eight-year-old daughter, Treasure. She's here in France seeking asylum and has struggled to learn French. During one of our visits to a local housing complex where many refugees live, we were introduced to her by another woman in our church. We invited her to come, and she's been faithful to attend most weeks. This

past week, I sat down with her and shared the gospel in English. Towards the end of the conversation, I asked if she had ever accepted Christ as her Savior and with tears in her eyes, she said no but she wanted to! She prayed to receive Christ that afternoon. It was such a blessing to see her receive salvation! Please keep Eunice and Treasure in your prayers. Before I left, Eunice asked me to text her some Bible verses so she could grow in her faith.

In July, several churches in our surrounding area will get together to hold a youth and teen camp. However, our big question is whether Germany, France, and Belgium will allow camp to be held or if there will still be too many restrictions in place for us to send any of our youth. Please pray that things will continue to improve and that we'll be able to send our young people this year.

On July 2nd, Adie and I have appointments with the immigration office for our annual visa renewals. We would appreciate your prayers! While we don't anticipate any issues, these visas are never guaranteed.
