

The last 6 weeks have gone by so quickly and we are blessed by all the love and encouragement we have received from all of our friends both far and near. I don't think we realize how much the Lord can use an email, text, or phone call that we make in someones life. Many times the Lord has encouraged Pam and I in a great way with a short note from one of you.

June was a very busy month. On the 11th I began the trip north with a 3 day drive to Edmonton where we sold our newer truck. I then flew to Inuvik to take care of some final details with our house and the church in Aklavik. During this trip I had the opportunity to preach both in Aklavik and Inuvik before Andrena and I started our drive back south with our packed trailer and older truck. The Lord blessed the trip with good weather and provision for every need at every stop. I figured it up and this was the 10th one way trip up or down the Alaska Highway over the past 16 years. It was also the quickest making 4000 miles pulling a trailer in 7 days.

In June the oncologist changed Pam's chemo regime with the results of the last PET scan and the tumor in her liver getting larger. This change has resulted in more severe side effects for her. The radiation treatment on her liver (it is called Y-90) went well according to the doctor, though it, along with the chemo side effects, has made her extremely weak and fatigued. These side effects will lessen after the

first few weeks. They will wait 3 months to give the radiation time to work before doing another scan.

Last week she had an appointment with the cardiologist to address her high heart rate. They still have one test to do, but her heart appears strong and he believes the high heart rate is also a result of her chemo treatments. This past Friday (July 15) we went for her chemo treatment and her blood work shows that her white blood cell count is critical low, making her body unable to fight off an infection. They did not do a treatment and put her on an antibiotic as a precaution. She is to avoid crowds and close contact with people and will have a follow up blood draw in a week. If she gets a fever or any symptoms of infection of any kind we are to take her to the ER immediately.

Words seem to fall short of expressing our gratitude for each of you and your prayers and encouragement, but all we can say is thank you and praise the Lord for your interceding for us.
