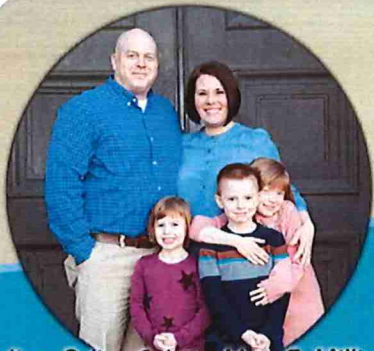

We've had a busy but wonderful summer! At the end of May, we gathered with the Baptist church about an hour north on "Ascension." Since we are in a French culture every major Catholic holiday is celebrated. Everyone had the day off work so we thought it would be a great

excuse to gather, study God's word and fellowship. There was a good turn out and we enjoyed breakout sessions for teaching, group singing, games and a BBQ lunch.

A few weeks ago, one of our ladies, Sandra, was moving from outside of town into Charleville-Mezieres, near the church. While I was helping her move, she introduced me to a friend of hers, Patrice, and said he was interested in coming to church. Since then, I've had the opportunity to sit down with him and share the gospel. Please pray that God will give him clarity in his spiritual life. He has been faithful to church since and our prayer is that he'll continue coming and God will work in his life.

Sandra, the woman I just mentioned, is in the process of immigrating to France and has been working on her papers for over five years now. The government can technically move these folks at any time to anywhere around the country they choose. Thankfully, they moved Sandra only about eight blocks from the church so now she can walk every week! She has a four-year-old daughter, Blessing, and a five-month-old baby girl, Mercy, as well. Please pray that Sandra would grow in her walk with the Lord and that she would continue to be faithful to bring her little girls to church.

This past week, I took some of our church

teens to an old, fortified city named Rocroi; which dates back over 400 years. We talked about the city's history and enjoyed seeing the magnitude of the wall's outer layers of protection. I used this to lead into a conversation about God being our Fortress and how we can trust in Him. I was able to share the gospel very clearly with them. If you would, please pray for Patience, Charity, and Winner. They've moved here with their mom, Stephanie, seeking asylum and our prayer is that they'll be saved!

I've often mentioned Eunice in past letters but haven't gone much into her background. Sadly, she was trafficked from Nigeria through Libya and became pregnant. She was able to escape to Italy before making her way to France where she started coming to church, heard the gospel, and got saved. Since she arrived about three years ago, she's been working on her papers and praying that God would allow her to stay here. Truly God has been answering prayers because last month she found out she was granted temporary residence status with the expectation of permanent status. It was such an encouragement to listen to her talk about how her faith has been increased through this process. Please continue to pray for Eunice and her daughter, Treasure, that they would be faithful to church and that they would continue growing and knowing the Lord better.



It's been a great summer. We've been able to make some improvements around the church and been blessed to have several new visitors coming faithfully. Please continue to pray that we'll be effective in ministry and that more people will come to the Lord and grow in faith! We couldn't do it without your prayers and support.
