It was almost midnight when I received a call from Jon (a brother from church). His father was at the hospital with a very serious infection. I got ready and headed to San Sebastian. Cirilo, Jon's dad, could hardly breath. The effort he had to make to take each breath of air was evident.

The next day I went back to the hospital and found out that he was much worse. At that moment I remembered that years ago I witnessed how a man that was in a coma would start to move when someone would read the Bible to him. That had left me very impressed. Pastor William Yant, a great servant of God that is now with the Lord, taught me with through this example that the Word of God is quick and powerful.

I stepped closer to Cirilo and started to share the Gospel with him, telling him that he did not have to be without hope. I noticed how his eyebrows moved, which showed me that he could hear me. Slowly, I gave him the Gospel and asked him to pray with me, asking the Lord to save him. Jon was very grateful to me, as was his mother. A few hours later Cirilo passed away. The apostle Paul told Timothy to preach the Gospel in season and out of season; whenever there is an opportunity, we must do so. I don't know what happened in his heart in that moment; I hope with all my heart that he called to the Lord and placed his faith in Christ as his Savior. Only God knows.

Jon and his mother asked me to preach at the funeral. It was a great privilege for me, not only because of their trust, but also because of such a great opportunity to share the Gospel with everyone that was present.

The funeral parlor was full and everyone there, excepting Tete and I and a few of the brethren that accompanied us, were Spaniards. I shared a clear and simple message of the Gospel that everyone heard with attention and respect. No one made the decision to place their faith in Christ, but when I was finished a man, one of Jon's uncles, came up to me to thank me for the message. "I am atheistic, but I liked your message very much," he told me. It was the first time he had heard something like this.

"In season and out of season," sometimes to sow, sometimes to reap; be it as it may, what an incredible privilege we have to be able to share the Gospel, which is the power of God unto salvation.
