Now we are just the Nolands." I heard a message recently on how God may change our identity through life direction and ministry positions many times. Right now my identity from my ministry position is Assistant Pastor of The Sweet Springs Baptist Church, but praise the Lord we will always be identified as a child of the King! Pam and I are thankful the Lord has worked to lead us to this church and provide this position where we may continue to serve Him.

The Lord has blessed us greatly over the last 20 years with faithful supporting churches. As we look back over all the people we have met and the places we have been able to minister since our first meeting and supporting church that took us on in September 2002 when we started deputation we are amazed at all the Lord has done. Not only has our family been privileged to serve, but awareness of the need for the gospel in the Arctic and other remote places of the world is known by many and there have been souls saved and a church still serving in the Hamlet of Aklavik because of your prayers, support, and encouragement.

As our transition back to the states is complete it is time to ask all of our regular support to be stopped by December 31, 2022. All Points Baptist Mission has been a great help as they have continued to handle all of our support through the transition. There are still several missionaries serving in the Arctic regions of the world so if your church would want to support one of them in our place you can either contact myself of Bro. We did get a good report from Pam's last PET scan that all of the cancer spots are shrinking. I will continue to send out email updates on her progress so people can continue to pray specifically for her needs.
